Jason Heyward led the Braves with 27 home runs. He finished right behind Freddie Freeman with 82 RBI while the Braves' first baseman led the team with 94 runs batted in. Freeman was second in homers (23). Catcher Brian McCann popped 20 dingers. Dan Uggla hit seventeen less home runs than the year before but drove in 78 runs. Martin Prado had the team high in base hits (186); Michael Bourn led the ball club in runs scored (96). Forty-year-old "Chipper" Jones, a Braves icon, called it a fabulous career after the final out. He had announced during Spring Training that 2012 would be his last season. He hit 14 homers and drove home 62 runs during his last and eighteenth campaign in a Braves' uniform...Atlanta went on to hit .247 and 149 home runs...With a 16-7 record, Tim Hudson was the ball club's top winning pitcher after off-season back surgery had improved his overall mobility. Tommy Hanson (13-10) led the staff in strikeouts (161). Lefty Mike Minor finished the year 11-10 in wins/losses and with 145 K's. Closer Craig Kimbrel whiffed 116 batters and led the N.L. in saves. The Braves hurlers ended the year with a 3.42 ERA...Atlanta, who barely missed the post-season in 2011, lost the National League Wild Card Game to the Cardinals, 6-3, at Turner Field and were knocked out of the playoffs.
