Chris "Crush" Davis led the O's with 33 home runs and 85 RBI. Adam Jones was next after hitting 32 homers, driving in eighty-two, and leading the team with 186 hits as well as 103 runs scored. Three other Orioles hit at least 22 dingers. The ball club hit .247 for the year and finished second in the A.L. with 214 homers...Lefty Wei-Yin Chen led the pitching staff with 12 wins and 154 K's. Miguel Gonzalez and Chris Tillman both won nine contests. The staff ERA was sixth in the league (3.90) and led the A.L. in saves (55)...Baltimore posted its first winning season since 1997. They beat the Rangers in the AL Wild Card Game, 5-1, at Texas, but were knocked from the playoffs by the Yankees in the ALDS, three games to two. The Birds and Yanks split their season series, 9-9... The O's won a 17-inning marathon at Boston, 9-6, on May 6th, with Chris Davis the winning pitcher-of-record. He struck out two batters in two innings of work. Red Sox position player, Darnell McDonald, was the losing pitcher--the first time since 1902 two POSITION players were the pitchers-of-record in a game.
