Following two seasons of heart-break which saw the Mets lose a post-season berth on the season's final day, hope sprang eternal with the opening of a new ball park, the long-awaited CITI FIELD, on April 13<sup>th</sup>. The Padres spoiled the home opener, winning 6-5...The ball club suffered through an injury plagued campaign: no fewer than 20 players would spend time on the disabled list, chief among them ace Yohan Santana, who was lost to elbow surgery for the year August 25<sup>th</sup>...Daniel Murphy led the team with 12 home runs. David Wright was the hitting star with 72 RBI, 164 base hits, and 88 runs scored. He and three other teammates each hit 10 homers. The Mets tied the Dodgers for the N. L.'s best BA (.270) but finished LAST in homers (95). The ultra-spaciousness of their new ball park greatly contributed to the latter figure...Before his year ended, Santana won 13 games and struck out 146 which held up as the pitching staff's highest marks. Mike Pelfrey won 10 games and punched out 107 batters. The staff ERA was 4.45, twelfth in the N. L....Just over 3.168 million fans gathered to watch the Mets during Citi Field's inaugural season, fifth best in the league.
