The Blue Jays came charging out of the starting blocks winning the first six series of the season and tying Boston for first place at the end of April. On May 12th, in their first meeting with the arch-rival Yankees, Roy Halladay beat former teammate A. J. Burnett before a sell-out crowd at Rogers Centre, 5-1. The Yanks captured the next two games, but the Jays swept the White Sox at home to give them the best record in the league (27-14) and a 3 ½ game lead in the AL East. By the time the ball club returned from a disastrous road trip during which they lost NINE straight games, they would be behind the Red Sox by 1 ½ games. At the All Star break, they had dropped 11 games behind with a 44-46 record. The team never challenged for a playoff spot the rest of the year. In July and August, combined, Toronto was 18-32...Aaron Hill produced a huge season by leading the team in home runs (36) and base hits (195). He drove home 108 and scored 103 runs. DH Adam Lind (35 homers) was the RBI leader (114). The Jays hit .266 as a team and 209 home runs...The pitching staff posted a 4.47 ERA and featured two double-digit winners: Halladay (17) and Ricky Romero (13). The staff ERA was tenth in the A. L. Halladay was fifth in league Cy Young Award voting and led the majors with nine complete games and four shutouts. He topped Jays hurlers with 208 strikeouts.
