The Marlins swept Washington (twice) and Atlanta while winning three of their first five series to open the season. With an 11-1 record, they moved on to Pittsburgh where they were swept by the Buccos in three games. The end of April showed Florida with a 14-8 mark but they fell to 23-28 overall by the last day of May. The ball club then posted four months with a winning record (in the fifth they played .500 ball) and finished the year SIX games behind the NL East champion Phillies which wrapped up their third best season ever in wins/losses...Dan Uggla drove in 90 runs and led "The Fish" with 31 homers. Hanley Ramirez was the N. L.'s batting champion (placing him third in the majors) and hit 24 home runs. He also logged team highs in RBI (106), base hits (197), and runs scored (101). Jorge Cantu knocked in 100 runs, smartly complimenting Cody Ross's 24 homers and 90 RBI. As a team, the Marlins hit .268 (third in the league) and 159 homers...Josh Johnson led the pitching staff with a 15-5 won/loss record. Ricky Nolasco won thirteen ball games and was the staff leader in strikeouts (195). Johnson was second with 191 K's. Juan Carlos Oviedo and Matt Lindstrom were primarily responsible for Florida leading the National League with 45 saves. The staff ERA was 4.29, ninth in the N.L...Marlins 2006 Number One amateur draft pick Chris Coghlan (9 homers, 47 RBI) won the National League's Rookie of the Year Award.
