In his second season as Dodgers skipper, Joe Torre once again guided his charges to their second consecutive post-season appearance after compiling the best record in the National League...On Opening Day at Dodger Stadium, Orlando Hudson became the first Dodger to hit for "the cycle" at home. He did it before a record crowd of over 57,000. On May 7th, Manny Ramirez was suspended for 50 games by MLB after testing positive for the use of a banned substance according to the collective bargaining agreement. Upon his return, Ramirez hit a homer July 20th against the Reds for his 537th career four-bagger to pass Mickey Mantle on the all-time career home run list. Two days later, Ramirez hit a pinch-hit grand slam versus the Reds on "Manny Ramirez Bobble Head Night" for his 21st career grand salami...In the NLDS, the Dodgers swept the Cardinals in three games but lost to the Phillies in the NLCS in five games for the second straight year...Andre Ethier was the Dodger leader in homers (31) and RBI (106). Matt Kemp slammed 26 home runs and drove home 101. He led the team in base hits (180) and runs scored (97). L. A. led the N. L. with a .270 team batting average; they hit 145 homers...The pitching staff turned in the league's best ERA (3.41). Chad Billingsley won twelve games and Randy Wolf eleven to top the staff. Clayton Kershaw rang up the most strikeouts (185). Closer Jonathan Broxton whiffed 114 batters. The staff struck out a total of 1,272, second highest in the N. L...For the first time, the Dodgers held Spring Training in Arizona after prepping in Florida's Vero Beach, at "Dodger Town," a former military camp, for 61 seasons.
