*The Mariners produced an improvement of 24 wins over the previous year's 100-loss campaign. A new manager and new players were a huge part of the upgrade: Newcomer Russell Branyan held down first base, blasted 31 home runs, and drove home seventy-six. Newbie Franklin Gutierrez was the everyday centerfielder and knocked out 15 homers to go with 70 RBI. Much to the pleasure of most Seattle fans, Ken Griffey, Jr. returned for one more go-round and hit 19 home runs with 57 RBI as the M's primary designated hitter....Jose Lopez added 25 dingers and led the ball club with 42 doubles and 96 RBI. Ichiro Suzuki picked up his 200<sup>th</sup> hit for the season on September 13<sup>th</sup>, which gave him NINE consecutive years with at least 200 safeties. (It also broke Wee Willie Keeler's long-standing record of eight.) Ichiro also led the majors with 225 hits (and 179 singles)....Ace Felix Hernandez tied three others to lead the majors with 19 wins and led the Mariners' staff with 217 strikeouts. Jarrod Washburn was next with eight victories...As a team, the M's hit .258 and 160 home runs while the staff posted the league's best ERA at 3.87.*
