On July 23<sup>rd</sup>, Mark Buehrle pitched a perfect game at U. S. Cellular Field in front of just over 28,000 fans against the Tampa Bay Rays. Outfielder Dewayne Wise made an out-of-this-world catch at the top of the left-centerfield fence to rob the Rays' Gabe Kapler of a possible home run in the ninth with no one out to preserve the "perfecto." The next batter struck out and the third out was a ground ball to shortstop. It was Buehrle's second career "no-no." He had no-hit the Rangers in April 2007. Home plate umpire Eric Cooper was behind the plate for both no-hitters. Ramon Castro, who had been obtained from the Mets, May 30<sup>th</sup>, was Buehrle's battery mate...The Chisox were tied for first place in the AL Central the day of Buehrle's perfect game (the score was 5-0), but they fell to second place the next day and wallowed in third for the majority of the remaining schedule...Paul Konerko led the ball club after slugging 28 homers and driving home eighty-eight. Speedy Scott Podsednik led the Sox in base hits (163) while Jermaine Dye scored the most runs (78). Dye also popped 27 home runs. As a team, the White Sox tallied 184 homers to go with a .258 batting average...Chisox hurlers posted the league's second best ERA (4.14). Buehrle and John Danks tied for a staff-high thirteen wins. Gavin Floyd won eleven games and was the leader in strikeouts (163).
