The Angels captured their third straight AL West Division title by ten games over runner-up Texas and topped the league with a .285 team batting average. Kendrys Morales slammed 34 homers and drove home 108 runs as the team leader. Three others combined to pop 67 home runs of the 173 the Angels collected during the season. Chone Figgins led the ball club with 183 base hits and 114 runs scored. Bobby Abreu was second to Morales with 103 RBI; he scored 96 runs...Jered Weaver and Joe Saunders both won sixteen ballgames to headline the pitching staff. John Lackey won eleven contests. Weaver topped the staff with 174 strikeouts; Lackey was next with 139. Newly-anointed closer Brian Fuentes led the big leagues in saves. The hurlers ended the year ninth in the A. L. after posting a 4.45 ERA...The Angels met the Red Sox in a best-of-five AL Division Series which the Halos dominated three games to none. The Yankees were the opposition in the ALCS and advanced to the World Series after winning the series four games to two. Los Angeles hit .238 to the Yanks .279 in the six contests. New York outthomered the Angels 8-3 and outscored them 33-19...Pitcher Nick Adenhardt was tragically killed in a car accident April 9<sup>th</sup> only hours after pitching six shutout innings against Oakland in his first start of the year. His former teammates hung a jersey with his uniform number in the Angels' dugout for home games and assigned him a locker in the Visitors' Clubhouse on the road.
