The Brewers finished with an identical record of 40-41 home and away. Versus their opponents within the NL Central they were 42-37...As a team, Brewers batters hit .263 for the year and 182 homers, good for third most in the league...Twenty-five-year-old Prince Fielder led the league (second in the majors) with 46 circuit clouts and tied the Phillies Ryan Howard for the most RBI in baseball (141). Ryan Braun followed with 32 home runs and 114 RBI. Mike Cameron, 36, had a solid season as well (24 homers, 70 RBI)...The Brewers pitching staff proved to be an effort-full-of-struggle all season long. Their 4.83 ERA ranked them second-to-last in the N. L. Starting pitching rang up a combined 5.19 ERA after the season's first four series. There were three double-digit winners: Braden Looper (14), Yovani Gallardo (13), and lefty Manny Parra (11). Gallardo's 204 strikeouts, by far, were the most on the staff. Parra whiffed 116 batters. Forty-one-year-old Trevor Hoffman ended the season fifth in the league in saves.
