The Bosox finished eight games behind the AL East champion Yankees, but still qualified for the AL Wild Card. They were eliminated from post-season play by the Angels. It was an up-and-down year for Boston: They were tied for first at the end of April then fell to third place behind New York after a 15-14 May. David Ortiz only hit .185 for the month while starter Daisuke Matsuzaka was placed on the disabled list after his first two starts. The Red Sox leaped back into first with an 18-8 June record but fell to second in favor of the Yanks on July 21<sup>st</sup> and chased New York the rest of the way...Boston slammed 212 home runs and hit .270 for the season. Jason Bay led the team with 36 homers and 119 RBI. Dustin Pedroia was the high-man with 185 base hits, 115 runs scored, and 48 doubles...Josh Beckett won 17 ball games to lead the pitching staff; he struck out 199. Jon Lester was 15-8 in wins/losses and topped the hurlers with 225 K's. Knuckleballer Tim Wakefield was an 11-game winner. Closer Jonathan Papelbon whiffed 76 batters. The staff ERA was 4.35, seventh in the A. L.
