"The Bronx Bombers" opened the new, billion dollar Yankee Stadium (across the street from the lot of "The House that Ruth Built"), April 16th, with a loss to Cleveland, 10-2. The Yankee bullpen gave up nine runs in the top of the seventh to seal the victory for The Tribe. On September 11th, Derek Jeter surpassed Lou Gehrig as the Yanks' all-time leader in base hits with number 2,722, a single, off the Orioles' Chris Tillman at Yankee Stadium...The new ballpark conceded a lot of homers based on Mark Teixeira's 39 four-baggers and 122 RBI to lead the team. Alex Rodriguez slammed thirty more and drove home 100 runs. Jeter led the team in hits (212) and tied Johnny Damon for the most runs scored (107). In all, seven Yankees hit at least 22 dingers. They topped the A.L. in homers (244) and were second in batting average (.283)...C C Sabathia led the pitching staff with a 19-8 W/L record and 197 K's. Fellow lefty Andy Pettitte won 14 games while A.J. Burnett was a 13-game winner. Eighth-inning set-up man David Robertson struck out 63 batters while closer Mariano Rivera whiffed seventy-two. The staff ERA was 4.26 and led the league with 51 saves...The Yanks outdistanced the Red Sox by eight games to win the AL East, swept the Twins in the ALDS, and knocked off the Angels in the ALCS in six games. In the 107th season of Yankee baseball, they went on to beat the Phillies in the World Series, four games to two, for their 27th World Championship and first since the 2000 season.
