The Giants spilled a lot of cash--\$43.57 million for six years--into the lap of Barry Bonds during the off-season. At that time, it was the largest payout to a single player in the history of the game for both its total number of dollars and amount paid in average annual salary. To celebrate, Bonds hit 46 home runs to go with 123 runs batted in. He led the majors with 365 total bases for the season and won his second straight N.L. MVP Award. He also led the ball club in runs scored (129) and base hits (181). The slugger's on-base percentage (.458) and RBI figure were the league's best; his slugging percentage (.677), OPS (1.136) and home run total were the highest in the majors. Matt Williams was second with 38 homers, 110 RBI, 170 base hits, and 105 runs scored. The Giants topped the league in batting average (.276) and were second in home runs (168)...The pitching staff ended the year fifth in ERA (3.61) and boasted TWO 20-game winners: John Burkett (22) and Bill Swift (21). The pair lost 15 games combined. Swift was the staff leader in strikeouts (157)...After leading the NL West by nine games on August 11th with a 77-38 record, the Giants won only twelve of their next thirty which allowed the Braves to move into the top spot by 3 ½ games by September 15th. San Francisco then reeled off fourteen wins in sixteen contests which placed them a single game in back of Atlanta with one game to go. The Dodgers clobbered the Giants, 12-1, at Dodger Stadium the last day of the season to ensure the Braves the division crown with 104 victories to the Giants one hundred three. The '93 Giants are the ONLY team in major league history to win 100+ games in a season and NOT make the post-season since the start of divisional play in 1969...Atlanta won the regular season series with the Giants, 7-6.
