The Dodgers reached the .500 mark in '93 following a last place finish the year before. They ended the season 23 games behind the NL West champion Braves who won their season series, 8-5. Against the arch-rival Giants and Reds, L. A. went 7-6 and 8-5, respectively...N. L. Rookie of the Year Mike Piazza was the spark the ball club needed to gain ground in the division standings. Everyone knows the story about Piazza, the 62<sup>nd</sup> Round Draft Pick by the Dodgers, who was selected as a favor by Manager Tom Lasorda to Piazza's dad. (Lasorda and the elder Piazza had been childhood buddies.) The kid worked his tail off and made good: He went on to set rookie records for home runs (35) and RBI (112). Piazza was second on the team in hits (174) and the leader in runs scored (81). Eric Karros followed his pal with 23 homers and 80 RBI. Brett Butler posted a team high 181 base hits. For the season, the Dodgers were tenth in the N.L. in batting average (.261) and home runs (130)...The pitching staff was a gem, finishing third in the league in ERA (3.50). Pedro Astacio's fourteen wins topped the staff. Kevin Gross was 13-13 in wins/losses while Orel Hershisier, the staff's ace, won twelve and dropped fourteen. Knuckleballer Tom Candiotti (eight victories) led the hurlers in strikeouts (155). Gross had 150 K's. Twenty-one-year-old (and Future Hall of Famer) Pedro Martinez worked primarily out of the bullpen and whiffed 119 batters. His brother Ramon won ten ballgames as a starter...After committing 42 errors in '92, shortstop Jose Offerman erred 37 more times in '93. His great speed and reliable bat kept him in the starting line-up.
