Throughout the Summer of '93, the Expos never spent a day in first place of the NL East, but they gave the division champion Phillies a run for their money, shadowing the Phils in second place for most of the season. After Game 81, Montreal was 43-37, in third place, just 9 ½ games out. When the season ended, the Expos were just three games behind. The Phillies won their season match-ups, 7-6...Rising star Larry Walker won a Gold Glove and led the ball club with 22 home runs. He drove in eighty-six for the year. Walker's counterpart patrolling centerfield, Marquis Grissom, led the team with 95 RBI, 188 base hits, and 104 runs scored. Grissom also was awarded a Gold Glove, finished tied for fifth in the majors in stolen bases, and added 19 homers to the Expos total of 122 for the season. As a team, they hit .257 and led the N.L. with 228 stolen bases...Ace Dennis Martinez won fifteen and lost nine to lead the pitching staff. He struck out 138 batters and was highly sought after by division competitor Atlanta who failed to acquire him on late-season waivers or via a trade. Spot starter Jeff Fassero won 12 ball games and led the staff in strikeouts (140). The staff was ranked fourth in the league with a 3.55 ERA...Despite a great line-up, the Expos finished thirteenth out of fourteen National League teams in attendance (1.6 million) at Stade Olympique.
