The Astrodome was the home of a pretty good ball club, which in the '93 season, just could not keep up with NL West rivals Atlanta and San Francisco, two teams that claimed at least 100 victories. The Astros ended 19 games in arrears of the champion Braves and 18 games behind the Giants. Houston posted a .267 team batting average and 138 home runs, sixth and eighth, respectively, among National League "nines"...Leading the pitching staff in wins was Mark Portugal (18). Pete Harnisch followed with 16 victories and 185 strikeouts, the latter the most on the staff. Harnisch tied the White Sox' Roger "Black Jack" McDowell for the most shutouts in the majors (four). Darryl Kile was in the win column 15 times; Greg Swindell won 12 contests. Doug Drabek was 9-18 in wins/losses, but tallied seven complete games and 157 K's. The staff ERA of 3.49 placed them second in the N. L....The home run leaders on the ball club were Craig Biggio (21), Jeff Bagwell (20), Luis Gonzalez (15), and Eric Anthony (15). Bagwell drove home the most runs (88) while Biggio topped the team with 175 base hits and 98 runs scored...In the season's early stages, the Astros spent eleven days in first place culminating with a half-game lead on May 10th. After a loss to the Braves the next day, Houston dropped to second but flipped between third and fourth place for the remainder of the year, never falling below the .500 mark.
