The Cardinals finished the season ten games behind the NL East champion Phillies and seven in back of second place Montreal. They were 5-8 versus Philadelphia and 5-8 against the arch-rival Cubs...This Cardinals ball club ended the season fourth in the N.L. in batting average (.272) and twelfth in home runs (118). Mark Whiten, who blasted FOUR titanic home runs and knocked in twelve in the same game at Cincinnati, September 7th, topped the Redbirds with 25 dingers. He drove in 99 runs. Todd Zeile (17 homers) was the team leader in RBI (103). Gregg Jefferies tallied the most base hits (186) and set a club record for steals by a first baseman. He was third in the league in batting average. Bernard Gilkey scored a team high 99 runs and stroked 40 doubles...Bob Tewksbury led the pitching staff with seventeen wins for the season. Rene Arocha was an 11-game winner while lefty Donovan Osborne was the winning pitcher of record ten times. The staff ERA of 4.09 ranked them eighth in the league...Closer Lee Smith was traded to the Yankees, August 31<sup>st</sup>, after achieving the individual career saves record which stood until 2006...For the first time since 1979, "The Wizard," Ozzie Smith, did not win a Gold Glove even though he still possessed his fabulous range in the field. His fielding percentage in '93 was .974, just below his career average.
