If the Mets' season in '92 was bad... '93 was even worse: Dallas Green replaced Jeff Torborg in the dugout, May 21st, after too many clubhouse confrontations between players and media as well as an alarming off-field incident involving Vince Coleman and fans in Los Angeles. The out-going skipper became the scapegoat for all the turmoil. He had lost control of the team based largely on testy relationships between some of the players and with their manager. Coleman's situation was the flash point. The ball club suspended and later traded him. Torborg departed with a 13-25 record. Green, with a booming voice and the temperament of a military drill instructor while in uniform, would go 46-78 for the rest of the year... Bobby Bonilla led the Mets with 34 home runs while Eddie Murray was tops with 100 RBI and 174 hits. Bonilla was second with 87 RBI. Murray hit 27 homers and Jeff Kent added twenty-one. The Mets hit .248 and 158 homers... "Doc" Gooden, with a 12-15 record, led the team in wins and strikeouts (149). Battling chronic substance and alcohol issues, Gooden was not nearly the same dominating pitcher he had been just a few years earlier. Reliever Anthony Young snapped a personal 27-game losing streak with a win over Florida, July 28th. Young's record for the year was 1-16. Behind Gooden, there were two seven-game winners: Lefty Frank Tanana and righty Bret Saberhagen. The staff ERA of 4.05 was seventh in the league... The Mets first 100-loss season since 1967.
