The Birds spent most of the season within reach of the AL East leaders, but never really could manage to get over the hump. (Baltimore, for one day, DID sneak into sole possession of first place by one-half game as late as July 20th after Ben McDonald beat Kansas City, 7-0.)...Camden Yards hosted the '93 All Star Game which involved a controversy between A. L. skipper Cito Gaston and Orioles pitcher Mike Mussina. "Moose" was slated to NOT pitch due to injury and had been reminded of that before the game by Gaston. However, in the top of the ninth inning, Mussina began warming up in the bullpen leading Orioles fans in attendance to believe he was coming into the game. When Gaston used another pitcher and not Mussina, the fans booed and showed their dissatisfaction with loud epithets from the stands the rest of the game and for the remainder of the year when Gaston's Blue Jays came to town. Some believed afterwards that Mussina--angry with Gaston--chose to warm up to show up the A. L. manager. Gaston reportedly received death threats after the incident...Team leaders: Chris Hoiles (29 homers); Cal Ripken, Jr. (90 RBI); Mussina (14 wins, 6 losses); McDonald (171 strikeouts, 7 complete games). Mark McLemore tied Ripken for the most base hits (165) while Brady Anderson tied Ripken with 87 runs scored. Hoiles was second with 82 RBI; Harold Baines socked 20 home runs and drove home 78...The Birds were fifth in the league in hitting (.267) and eighth with 157 homers for the season...The pitching staff ranked seventh at the end of the year with a 4.31 ERA.
