This Tigers ball club could hit with the best of 'em--maybe the most potent line-up in franchise history--and proved it by scoring 8 ½ runs per game (a pace to 1,300) in the first six weeks of the season. They scored 20 times versus Oakland during the home opener; 20 against Seattle a few days later; and in a three-game series at Minnesota, they scored a total of 45 runs to go with 46 base hits, 22 walks, and 23 extra base hits--11 of them home runs. Detroit jumped into first place April 23rd and would be King of the Jungle (largely alone in the top spot) through June 25th. For the year, the Tigers hit .275 (third in the A. L.) and 178 homers (2nd). The team's power came from the bats of Cecil Fielder (30 home runs, 117 RBI); Travis Fryman (22 homers, 97 RBI, 182 base hits, 98 runs scored); and super-utilityman Mickey Tettleton (32 home runs, 110 RBI). Five other Tigers hit a combined 67 home runs. Tony Phillips led the team in runs scored (113). The Tigers would lead the American League with 899 runs...The pitching staff, in turn, gave up lots and lots of runs to the opposition. They finished thirteenth in the league after giving up 837. The staff ERA was twelfth (4.65). John Doherty was the big winner with fourteen. Mike Moore and Bill Gullickson both were victorious thirteen times. David Wells won eleven. Wells was the strikeout leader (139). Those four prime starters, combined, posted an average ERA of 4.81...Through Game 81, Detroit was in third place with a 44-37 record just five games out. They lost ten straight games from June 22nd through July 1st.
