The Marlins' inaugural season. They played their games at the Dolphins' Joe Robbie Stadium. Team leaders: Orestes Destrade (20 homers, 87 RBI); Chris Hammond (11 wins); and Charlie Hough (126 strikeouts). Jeff Conine led the ball club with 174 hits and 24 doubles while Bennie Santiago was tops with six triples. Conine (79 RBI) and Chuck Carr tied for a team high 75 runs scored. Dave Magadan was the leader with a .400 on-base percentage...Closer Bryan Harvey posted the third most saves in the National League...

"The Fish," as they were soon referred, finished the season thirty-three games behind the NL East champion, Phillies, and FIVE games ahead of the last place Mets. Florida won two season series: over the Cubs (7-6) and the Padres (7-5). However, New York was the victor in nine of thirteen season meetings...As a team, the Marlins batted .248 and hit 94 home runs. The staff ERA was 4.13 and eighth in the league with 945 strikeouts...Nigel Wilson was the ball club's first pick in the expansion draft. He only played seven games with the Marlins in '93 batting zero for sixteen with eleven strikeouts. He would spend all of 1994 in Triple A...The coaching staff included the skipper's brother, Marcel, as the pitching coach; Octavio "Cookie" Rojas at third base; Vada Pinson at first base; Doug Rader as hitting coach; and former big-league pitcher Frank Reberger (Giants/Padres/Cubs) in the bullpen.
