Macho Row

The summer when the Phightin' Phils looked like some scruffy Industrial League slow-pitch softball team filling out their red-pinstriped uniforms. Beards, long hair, and dirty uniforms were the norm for this ball club. THESE GUYS COULD REALLY PLAY AND NEVER QUIT!! It was a time when Harry Kalas (Harry the K) sounded so beautiful with his basso voice bellowing out the name "MickEEEE MOR-an-DEEE-Nee"....The heavily favored Braves were vanquished in six games for the National League title, but the Phils' year would end in disappointment and heartache when Toronto won the '93 World Series, four games to two. Joe Carter's famous (or infamous) walk-off home run in Game Six at SkyDome ended the dream...Darren Daulton had signaled for what he wanted; Carter simply hit a perfect pitch according to "Dutch."

Team leaders: Darren Daulton (24 homers, 105 RBI); Pete Incaviglia (24 home runs, 89 RBI). Dave Hollins (18 homers) knocked in ninety-three. Lenny Dykstra (19 dingers, 66 RBI) led the majors with 143 runs scored and was second in bases on balls with 129 for the season. He led the Phils with 194 base hits and 44 doubles...Ace Curt Schilling and Tommy Greene each won sixteen games while Schilling led the staff with 186 K's. Greene punched out 167 batters. Ben Rivera won thirteen; Danny Jackson and Terry Mulholland each won twelve games...The staff ERA was 3.95 and first in the N. L. with 24 complete games and 1,117 strikeouts...At the plate, the Phillies hit .274 and led the league in runs scored (877), hits (1,555), doubles (297), and walks (665)...This may be Phillies' fans favorite team of all time. Jim Fregosi was Manager of the Year.
