George Brett had been the "face-of-the-franchise" for a lot of years, but all good--in this case--GREAT things come to an end. Brett spent his last season (all with one club) as the Royals designated hitter and closed out his career with 19 home runs and 75 RBI. Not bad for a forty-year-old. The man's career stats are amazing: .305 batting average, 3,154 base hits, 317 home runs, and 1,596 RBI over 2,707 games played. The team hit .263 for the season and 125 home runs. Mike Macfarlane, with twenty of those round-trippers, led the Royals; his 67 RBI were third to Mr. Brett. Wally Joyner whacked 15 homers and drove home 65 while Gary Gaetti swatted 14 and the skipper's son, Brian, hit 12 and drove in 69 runs...Kevin Appier was an 18-game winner, the most on the pitching staff; his 186 strikeouts were second to David Cone's 191 K's. Cone won eleven ball games, six being complete games. Appier's ERA was the best in the A. L. and third best in the majors. Swingman Tom Gordon was a winner twelve times and whiffed 143 batters. Closer Jeff Montgomery led the league in saves...On July 6th, the Royals were in a tie for first place, but the next day they dropped to second and switched between that spot and third most of the year. Versus their AL West opponents, K. C. put up a 41-37 record...Kauffman Stadium still retains its artificial playing surface in '93. That will change to natural grass in 2004.
