After running up an 8 ½ game lead in the NL Wild Card standings going into September, the Braves stumbled and bumbled to a 9-18 record in the final month and missed the post-season. They DID have a chance on the season's final day to reach the playoffs but after a Cardinals' win and a Braves' loss they were eliminated...Closer Craig Kimbrel was named the National League Rookie of the Year. The 23-year old hardballer led the league in saves and struck out 127 batters for the season. His save total set a new rookie record...Dan Uggla led the ball club with 36 circuit clouts, 82 RBI and 88 runs scored. He ran up a 32-game hitting streak which had started July 4<sup>th</sup> to break the team record held by Rico Carty. The record-setting hit was a homer, one of thirteen Uggla popped during the streak. Brian McCann was next with 24 dingers while Freddie Freeman hit 21 homers and drove home seventy-six. Thirty-nine year old "Chipper" Jones played in 126 games and socked 18 homers to go with 70 RBI. The Braves hit .243 for the year and were third in home runs in the N.L. (173)...Tim Hudson was the ace of the pitching staff with his 16 victories. He had 158 K's. Brandon Beachy (7-3 W/L record) led the staff in strikeouts (169). Jair Jurrjens won thirteen games. Tommy Hanson finished 11-7 with 142 punch outs. The staff ERA was fourth in the league (3.48). They topped the senior circuit in strikeouts (1,332).
