Justin Verlander pitched his second career no-hitter against Toronto, May 7th, while on his way to completing a pitcher's Triple Crown: Most wins (24), best ERA, and most strikeouts (250) in the American League. Versus the Blue Jays during his "no-no" the big righthander had a perfect game going into the last of the eighth. He gave up a lead-off walk in the inning which was later erased in a double play. The Tigers' ace faced the minimum 27 batters and struck out four Jays in the ball game. Verlander also was the A. L.'s Cy Young Award recipient as well as the league's Most Valuable Player. Max Scherzer was 15-9 with 174 strikeouts. Rick Porcello won 14 games while Brad Penny finished the year 11-11 in wins/losses. Closer Jose Valverde led the majors in saves and struck out 69 batters. The staff's ERA was 4.04...Miguel Cabrera won the A.L. Batting Championship. "Miggy" led the Tigers with 30 home runs, 105 RBI, 197 base hits, 111 runs scored, and 48 doubles. DH Victor Martinez hit just 12 dingers but was good for 103 RBI. Jhonny Peralta socked 21 homers and drove home eighty-six. Catcher Alex Avila cracked 19 taters and 33 doubles. His solid defense made him one of the best backstops in the league. Detroit was third in the A.L. in hitting (.277) and seventh in home runs (169)...The Tigers beat the Yankees in the ALDS, three games to two, but lost the ALCS to Texas, 4-2. Detroit clinched the AL Central title with eleven games left in the regular season, the earliest by the ball club since 1984...The team compiled its first 11-game winning streak since the 1968 World Championship season.
