The Angels franchise celebrated its 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary as a major league ball club finishing 10 games behind AL West champion Texas...Phenom Mike Trout made his major league debut, July 8<sup>th</sup>, at the age of nineteen, going zero for three against Seattle. In forty games he hit five home runs and drove in sixteen. He also scored 20 runs and stole four bases. Torii Hunter cracked 23 jacks and was second with 82 RBI. Vernon Wells was good for 25 round-trippers. Erick Aybar led the Angels in hits (155) while Howie Kendrick had the team high in runs scored (86). During the season, Anaheim hit .253 and 155 homers...Jered Weaver led the pitching staff with an 18-8 record and 198 strikeouts. Dan Haren was 16-10 with 192 K's. Ervin Santana no-hit the Indians at Cleveland, July 27<sup>th</sup>, striking out ten, walking one batter, and allowing one unearned run. He ended the season with an 11-12 record. Closer Jordan Walden struck out 67 batters. Weaver, Haren, and Santana all completed four ball games. Weaver led the staff with three shutouts. The Angels' hurlers led the A.L. with a 3.57 ERA and finished second with 12 complete games...After the disappointing 2010 campaign, the Angels played well enough to be tied or lead the AL West for 24 days up until July 5<sup>th</sup>. Their biggest lead was two games, May 10<sup>th</sup>.
