Ryan Howard led the ball club with 33 homers and 116 RBI. "The Flyin' Hawaiian," Shane Victorino, posted a "triple double" at the plate with 27 doubles, 16 triples, and 17 home runs. He had the team high in runs scored (95). Jimmy Rollins socked 16 homers, drove in sixty-three, and topped the Phils in base hits (152). Utilityman John Mayberry, Jr. cracked 15 home runs. As a team, the Phillies hit .254 (ninth in the league) and 153 homers (fifth in the N.L.)...Roy Halladay, with a 19-6 record, was the pitching staff's top winner. He whiffed 220 batters and won the N.L.'s Cy Young Award. Cliff Lee (17-8) was tops in strikeouts (238). Cole Hamels ended the season 14-9 with 194 K's. Philadelphia's hurlers had the lowest ERA in the senior circuit (3.02) and allowed the fewest runs (529)...The Phils posted the majors' best record for the second straight year. The ball club sprinted out of the gate with an 18-8 record in April. On May 9<sup>th</sup>, they had the best record in baseball, an achievement they would hold the remainder of the season...The "Phightins" lost to the eventual World Champion Cardinals in the NLDS, three games to two, after winning the NL East for the fifth consecutive year and being highly favored before the season to win the World Series.
