Curtis Granderson, "The Grandy Man," had a terrific season (41 homeruns, 119 RBI) and was strongly considered for the A.L.'s Most Valuable Player Award. On August 25th, Granderson, Russell Martin, and Robbie Cano made the Yankees the first team in major league history to have three different players hit a grand-slam home run in the same game. The feat came against Oakland in a game "The Bronx Bombers" won, 22-9. On July 9th, Derek Jeter hit a home run against Tampa Bay for the 3,000th hit of his career. He became the 28th player in major league annals to reach such lofty territory. Granderson not only led the Yanks in homers and RBI, he had a team high of 136 runs scored and hit for a "triple double" as he added 26 doubles and ten triples to his home run count. Mark Teixeira blasted 39 home runs and drove in one hundred eleven. Robinson Cano ended the regular season with 46 doubles, 28 taters, 118 RBI, 104 runs scored, and a team high 188 base hits. New York led the A.L. with 222 home runs and finished fifth with a .263 batting average...Starter C C Sabathia led the pitching staff with 19 wins, 230 strikeouts, and three complete games. Ivan Nova was 16-4 for the year. A. J. Burnett was 11-11 with 173 K's while Freddy Garcia won twelve ball games. Reliever David Robertson whiffed 100 batters. The staff led the league with 1,222 strikeouts and were fourth in ERA (3.73)...The Yanks lost to the Tigers in the ALDS in five games--the elimination game the first they lost at home since 2007.
