David Wright led the Mets with 29 home runs, 103 RBI, and 87 runs scored. For all his success in the batter's box, the usually slick-fielding Wright had an uncharacteristically tough season in the field after committing 20 errors. Top prospect Ike Davis was called up in early April and didn't disappoint when he hit 19 homers and drove in 71 runs. Jose Reyes had a "triple double" with 29 doubles, 10 triples, and 11 home runs. Angel Pagan (11 dingers) led the team with 168 hits. The Mets hit .249 with 128 homers for the year...The pitching staff was led by Mike Pelfrey's 15-9 record and Jonathon Niese's 148 strikeouts. Johan Santana and R. A. Dickey each won 11 games. Hisanori Takahashi was a ten-game winner. Closer Frankie Rodriguez whiffed 67 batters. The staff was sixth in the N.L. with a 3.70 ERA...The Mets were a team expected to compete with a strong, rebound season after a highly disappointing, injury plagued 2009. However, the ball club came in with a losing record which cost GM Omar Minaya and MGR Jerry Manuel their respective jobs. The Mets' last playoff appearance had been in 2006.
