The Tigers spent most of the season hovering among the AL Central leaders in second or third place. (At the All Star break, they trailed first place Chicago by just a half-game.) However, injuries to several regulars prevented the Tigers from making a strong move to the top...On June 2nd against Cleveland at Comerica Park, Armando Galarraga came within ONE out of a perfect game but first base umpire Jim Joyce called an Indians' base runner safe at first in a very close play. Replay later showed the third out HAD been made--the perfect game was lost. Joyce apologized to Galarraga after the game for his miscue. For his part, Galarraga handled the situation like a true professional...Miguel Cabrera was Detroit's top producer at the plate with 45 doubles, 38 home runs, and a league-leading 126 runs batted in. Ryan Raburn was next with 15 homers; Brandon Inge finished second with 70 RBI. Rookie Austin Jackson was second in AL Rookie of the Year voting. He led the ball club with 181 base hits and was second with 103 runs scored...The Tigers hit 152 home runs and .268 as a team...Ace Justin Verlander led the pitching staff with an 18-9 won/loss record and 219 strikeouts. Max Scherzer (who spent a brief time in the minors) was 12-11 with 184 K's. He had been obtained in a three-team trade from Arizona December 8, 2009. Rick Porcello was a ten-game winner...The staff posted a 4.30 ERA...Detroit ended the season 13 games in back of the first place Twins and were 52-29 at home, 29-52 on the road...Cabrera finished second in league MVP voting.
