Paul Konerko had a monster season at the plate in leading the White Sox with 39 home runs, 111 RBI, and batting well over .300. Carlos Quentin followed by launching 26 homers and driving in 87 runs. Alex Rios chipped in with 21 jacks and 88 runs batted in. All of the previously mentioned were part of 177 home runs hit by the White Sox; they were fifth in the league with a .268 team batting average...John Danks was the leader of the pitching staff with fifteen victories and 162 strikeouts. Mark Buehrle won thirteen, Freddy Garcia twelve, and Gavin Floyd ten games. Floyd had 151 punch outs. Side-arming flame thrower Chris Sale made his first big league appearance, August 6th, versus Baltimore. He yielded a base hit and a walk in less than an inning. Sale struck out 32 batters and walked ten during his brief stint with the Big Club...The White Sox pitching staff ended the year with a 4.09 ERA...In June and July, Chicago went 36-17 at home and 15-10 on the road to remain solidly in the pennant race. During August and September, they went 13-16 at home and 17-13 on the road to fall behind in the stretch run. The White Sox ended the season just six games behind first place Minnesota who handily won the season's battles with Chicago, 13-5. On the other hand, "The Good Guys" (according to White Sox broadcaster Ken Harrelson), were a fabulous, 22-4, combined, versus the Red Sox, Angels, and Mariners.
