On August 4<sup>th</sup>, Alex Rodriguez hit his 600<sup>th</sup> career home run against Toronto becoming the youngest player in major league history to reach that mark. The defending World Champions drew over 3.7 million fans to the "new" Yankee Stadium--tops in the American League...Mark Teixeira led the team with 33 homers and 113 runs scored. Rodriguez was tops with 125 RBI while socking 30 home runs for the season. Robbie Cano and Nick Swisher (89 RBI) both slugged 29 dingers. Cano accounted for 109 RBI and led the ball club with 200 hits and 41 doubles. Jorge Posada added 18 homers. Derek Jeter was second on the team after scoring 111 times and stroking 179 base hits. Curtis Granderson was good for 24 round-trippers. The Yankees hit .267 for the season and ended the year third in the A.L. with 201 home runs. Their 859 runs scored were the league high...C C Sabathia was the leader of the pitching staff with 21 wins and 197 strikeouts. Phil Hughes was 18-8 while Andy Pettitte won his 200<sup>th</sup> game as a Yankee June 11<sup>th</sup> and finished the year 11-3 in wins and losses. A. J. Burnett and Javier Vazquez both won ten ball games. The staff ERA was seventh in the A.L. (4.06)...The Yankees knocked off the Twins, three games to none, in the ALDS, but lost to the Rangers in the ALCS, four games to two...The franchise lost two team leaders during the season: Principal owner George Steinbrenner III and former manager Ralph Houk. The famous and very familiar voice of public address announcer Bob Sheppard was lost two days before Steinbrenner passed away. Sheppard was 99 years young. No one will EVER duplicate his distinct delivery.
