**The Phillies appeared to be on the path to another World Championship after sweeping the Reds in the NLDS, 3-0. The Giants ended their odyssey by knocking the Phils from the post-season, four games to two, in the NLCS...Ryan Howard was the team leader with 31 home runs and 108 RBI. Jayson Werth blasted 27 homers and led the ball club in runs scored (106) while "The Flyin' Hawaiian," Shane Victorino, posted a "triple double" with 26 doubles, 10 triples, and 18 home runs. He was also awarded a Gold Glove. Werth racked up 46 two-baggers. Raul Ibanez and Chase Utley both added 16 dingers. Placido Polanco was tops on the club with 165 base hits. The Phils hit .260 for the year and 166 home runs...NL Cy Young Award winner Roy Halladay led the pitching staff with a 21-10 record, 219 strikeouts, and nine complete games. "Doc" pitched the 20th perfect game in major league history in Miami against the Marlins, May 29th. He struck out eleven batters in the game. Roy Oswalt was a terrific 7-1 as a starter after being acquired from Houston for J. A. Happ. Cole Hamels won twelve games and collected 211 K's. Kyle Kendrick was 11-10 for the season. The staff ERA was fifth in the N.L. at 3.67 and had the most complete games (14)...Jimmy Rollins returned to the line-up in late June after an extended stint on the disabled list. "J-Roll" used his abbreviated season to hit eight homers and drive in forty-one runs.**
