Pablo Sandoval (aka "The Kung Fu Panda" because of his bear-like size) hit 13 homers, drove in 63 runs, and stroked 34 doubles. For his size, he played a strong third base and was enormously popular with the fans. Aubrey Huff led the ball club with 26 home runs, 86 RBI, 165 hits, and 100 runs scored. Juan Uribe followed with 24 dingers and 85 RBI. National League Rookie of the Year "Buster" Posey was called up at the end of May and fit right in with 18 homers and 67 RBI. His natural talent and leadership added a spark to the team from his much ballyhooed arrival to season's end. The Giants collectively hit .257 and 162 home runs...Tim Lincecum led the pitching staff with a 16-10 record and 231 strikeouts. Jonathan Sanchez was 13-9 and whiffed 205 batters. Matt Cain went 13-11 and topped the staff with four complete games. Giants hurlers led the N.L. with an excellent 3.36 ERA...They beat the Braves, 3-1, in the NLDS as Lincecum got things rolling by striking out fourteen in Game One allowing just two hits. The Phillies, seeking their third straight National League pennant, were eliminated, 4-2, in the NLCS. The Giants became World Champions for the first time since 1954 and their days at the Polo Grounds: The Texas Rangers were sent home for the winter after the Giants won the Fall Classic, four games to one. Edgar Renteria was named Series MVP after hitting .412, socking two home runs (including the one that decided the Series), and driving in six.
