The Reds made the post-season for the first time since 1995 but were swept in the NLDS by the Phillies, 3-0...First baseman Joey Votto was named National League MVP. He had a remarkable season leading the Reds in homers (37), RBI (113), doubles (36), hits (177), and runs scored (106). Jay Bruce slugged 25 homers and drove in 70 runs. Scott Rolen added 20 dingers and 83 RBI to the offense. The Redlegs led the N.L. with a .272 batting average, 188 home runs, and runs scored (790)...At 17-10, Bronson Arroyo was the pitching staff's top winner. He struck out 121 batters. Johnny Cueto posted the most strikeouts (138) and finished with twelve wins and seven losses. "Homer" Bailey (4-3) whiffed 100 opponents after returning to the line-up from arm miseries. The staff ended the year second in the league with a 4.01 ERA...Cincinnati moved into first place of the NL Central for good August 15th after Bailey beat the Marlins, 2-0. A Jay Bruce walk-off home run defeated the Astros, 3-2, in Cincinnati September 28th to clinch the division title by five games over the Cardinals.
