The Rays won their second consecutive AL East Division title by one game over the Yankees...At the end of April, the Rays held the best record in the American League at 17-6. Consistent winning continued and by the end of August, they were 81-51 with the post-season well in their sights just one game behind the first place Yankees. The division title came down to the last day of the season. The Yankees lost to the Red Sox while the Rays beat Kansas City to win the AL East for the second time in three years. The Rangers eliminated the Rays in the ALDS, three games to two, with the visiting team winning each game. Joe Maddon's ball club had won four of six games against Texas during the regular season...Carlos Pena led the Rays with 28 homers. Evan Longoria was team leader with 104 RBI and 46 doubles. Carl Crawford had the team high in base hits (184) and runs scored (110). As a team, they hit .247 and 160 homers...David Price went 19-6 and struck out 188 batters to lead the pitching staff. Matt Garza finished the season 15-10 while James Shields won thirteen and racked up 187 K's. Jeff Niemann and Wade Davis both won twelve. The staff was second in the A.L. in ERA (3.78). They led the league with 51 saves.
