After finishing at the bottom of the National League standings in '66 in his first year as manager, "Lippy" Durocher used his strong will and feistiness to elevate the Cubbies to 28 more victories and a rousing third place finish in '67. They battled the World Champion Cardinals to a 6-11 season series record and ended the year 14 games in back of the Redbirds...The Cubs' batting average was slightly less than the prior year, and they hit fewer homers (.251 BA, 128 HR in '67, both third in the N. L.). They received great seasons from Ron Santo (31 HR, 98 RBI); "Sweet Swingin'" Billy Williams (28 HR, 84 RBI); and thirty-six-year-old Ernie Banks (23 HR, 95 RBI). Santo and Williams both tied for the team lead with 176 base hits while Santo scored the most runs (107)...Fergie Jenkins was the undisputed ace of the pitching staff with his 20 wins, 236 strikeouts, and major league high 20 complete games. Southpaw Rich Nye was 13 up, 10 down for the year; rookie Joe Niekro won ten ballgames. The staff ERA of 3.48 was seventh best out of ten teams in the league...Santo broke both the N. L. record and his personal record with 393 assists.
