The 1967 Buccos won eleven fewer games than in 1966 which saw them slide from third in '66 to sixth and 20 ½ games out of first at season's end. They DID win their season meetings versus the World Champion Cardinals, 11-7. Manager Harry Walker was replaced on July 18<sup>th</sup> by former skipper Danny Murtaugh on an "interim" basis. Walker's record was 42-42, Murtaugh's 39-39. Murtaugh returned as full-time manager in 1970...The Bucs raked for a .277 team batting average, the best in the majors and 14 points ahead of the second place Cardinals. Roberto Clemente (third in MVP voting) led the big leagues in batting average and base hits (209). He was also the Pirates leader in homers (23), RBI (110), and runs scored (103). Willie Stargell, 27, had 20 jacks. As a team, they hit 91 home runs...Big lefty Bob Veale threw "pills" to lead the pitching staff in strikeouts (179) and wins (16). Soft-tossing Tommie Sisk was a winner 13 times and topped the staff with 11 complete games. Veale completed six. The staff finished second-to-last in the N. L. with a 3.74 ERA.
