- 1910 Franklin P. Adams "Baseball's Sad Lexicon" (Based on the Cubs heated rivalry with the Giants at that time.)

These are the saddest of possible words: Tinker to Evers to Chance. Trio of bear cubs, and fleeter than birds: Tinker to Evers to Chance. Ruthlessly pricking our gonfalon bubble, making a Giant hit into a double-words that are heavy with nothing but trouble: Tinker to Evers to Chance.

Mr. Adams wrote a weekly column for the New York Evening Mail. The Cubs finished SECOND to the PIRATES in '09, six-and-one-half games behind the Pittsburghers. The Pirates won the season series, 13-9. The "double" in Mr. Adams's verse refers to the plethora of double plays turned by the Cubs' HOF infielders (Joe Tinker/Johnny "The Crab" Evers/Frank "Husk" Chance)...*Chicago were the defending National League champions the three previous seasons. (They would be champs again in 1910.) The Cubs hit .245 as a team and in the "deadball" era they clouted twenty home runs and sixty triples. Tinker and Frank Schulte tied for the team lead in triples (11) and homers (4)...The dominating pitching staff completed the season with a miniscule 1.75 ERA. Mordecai Brown, an Indiana coal miner and farm boy who had lost parts of two fingers on his pitching hand during his youth working a food-chopper, was 27-9 in wins/losses with 32 complete games. He led the N.L. in both categories. His disfigured hand allowed him to throw the most wicked curveball in baseball with a remarkable spin rate. Orval Overall was a 20-game winner while Ed Reulbach would win nineteen and lefty Jack Pfister seventeen. Overall topped the majors with 205 strikeouts. Cubs starters accounted for 97 percent of the team's victories, a record which still stands to this day. The staff completed 111 ball games, including 32 shutouts.*
