When the '94 season shut down, August 12<sup>th</sup>, with another players' strike, the Marlins were 23 ½ games behind the NL East leading Montreal Expos. During the regular season, "The Fish" won two of the nine games played between the two...Florida's team leader, Gary Sheffield, topped the ball club with 27 home runs and finished second with 78 RBI. He tied Chuck Carr for the team high in runs scored (61). Jeff Conine followed with 18 dingers, a team leading 82 RBI, 144 base hits and 27 doubles. Benny Santiago added 11 homers. The season ended with the Marlins batting .262 and slugging .94 home runs...David Weathers led the pitching staff with eight wins. He struck out 72 and walked 59 batters. Pat Rapp won seven ball games and topped the staff with 75 K's. Forty-six year old knuckleballer Charlie Hough concluded a 25-year career with a 5-9 won/loss record, 65 strikeouts and 52 bases on balls. Reliever Robb Nen was a victor in five ball games and whiffed sixty. Closer Bryan Harvey's year ended early with elbow miseries from throwing the split-finger fastball. He would pitch in just one game in '95. The staff finished eleventh in the N.L. with a 4.50 ERA.
