The Yankees fielded their usual powerhouse and great pitching in '54, but they could do no better than be the runner-up to the Indians from Cleveland who streaked to 111 victories. The two ball clubs split their season series, 11-11...Yogi Berra hit 22 homers and led the team with 125 RBI. Mickey Mantle with his great natural abilities kept getting better: 17 doubles, 12 triples, 27 home runs, 102 RBI, and a major league leading 129 runs scored. But it was Yogi who won the A.L. MVP Award. Bill Skowron joined the ball club and hit well over .300 to go with nine triples, seven home runs and 41 RBI. The Yanks led the league with a .268 batting average and 805 runs. They hit 133 homers...Bob Grim led the pitching staff with a 20-6 W/L record. "Whitey" Ford was 16-8 while spot starter Allie Reynolds, now 37, ended the year thirteen up and four down. The staff finished third in the league with a 3.26 ERA.
