After only the seventh game of the season--April 11th, a 6-3 loss to the Mets in Montreal--the Expos remained under the .500 mark the rest of the year. The All Star break found them in fourth place of the NL East and 19 ½ games out of first with a 33-51 record. They were a paltry 19-31 versus division foes in finishing 35 games behind division champ Atlanta...First time All Star, Vladimir Guerrero, 24, completed a MVP-type campaign with 42 homers, 131 RBI, 193 base hits, and 102 runs scored, all team highs. Rondell White followed with 22 jacks and 64 RBI. The team ended the year eleventh in batting average (.265) and thirteenth in home runs (163)...Dustin Hermanson and Javier Vazquez posted the most wins on the pitching staff (nine). Hermanson's 145 strikeouts led the group. Ugueth Urbina, 25, who rang up 100 K's, led the majors in saves. The staff ERA was 4.69.
