First baseman Derrek Lee produced a remarkable season: He led the big leagues in batting average, slugging percentage (.662), OPS (1.080), total bases (393), and extra-base hits (99). He tied the Orioles Miguel Tejada for the most doubles (50). His 46 home runs were second in the N. L. to the Braves Andruw Jones's 51 while his 199 base hits were the league-high. Lee's on-base percentage (.418) was sixth-best in the majors. All these off-the-chart numbers and a Gold Glove earned him a third place rank in N. L. MVP voting. Lee led the Cubbies with 107 RBI. Third baseman Aramis Ramirez was second with 31 jacks and 97 RBI. Jeromy Burnitz blasted 24 home runs. Chicago finished second in the N. L. with a .270 team BA and 194 homers...The pitching staff posted 1,256 strikeouts to lead the league; Carlos Zambrano paced the bunch with 202 K's and 14 wins. Greg Maddux, 39, was the winner in 13 ballgames; Mark Prior picked up 11 victories and 188 strikeouts. Cub chuckers ended the year with a 4.19 ERA...The Cubs never led the NL Central and at the All Star break were 43-44, in third place, 12 ½ games out. Versus the division they were 43-36.
