The Devil Rays should have stayed in their pond. The high-mark of the year for this ballclub was a game OVER .500 on April 9th, the fifth game on the schedule. The season's first half ended with the D-Rays in last place of the AL East, 22 games out of first with a record of 28-61 (.315). Against their divisional competitors, the team was 31-44 in wins/losses but a surprising 11-8 versus the Yankees, the division champion. The D-Rays longest winning streak was six games and the longest losing skein ten...At the plate, the ballclub was pretty solid: a .274 BA, third in the league and a total of 157 HR, eighth overall. Team speed was a big plus. Their 151 stolen bases and 40 triples were both second in the A. L. Carl Crawford was the league leader with 13 three-baggers. Crawford tied for fifth in the majors in swiped bags; Julio Lugo came in eighth. Jorge Cantu walloped 28 home runs, 40 doubles, and drove in 117 to pace the team. Aubrey Huff was next with 22 jacks and 92 RBI...The pitching staff finished second-to-last with a horrid 5.39 ERA. Mark Hendrickson won the most games (11); Scott Kazmir had 10 wins and led the staff in strikeouts (174).
