The schedule-makers must have foreseen the future when they scheduled The Tribe and White Sox for a season-ending three game series between the two AL Central combatants in Cleveland. The Indians needed to sweep the series in order to tie the White Sox's record; however, the Sox held a tie-breaker over the Indians and therefore could claim the division title. Chicago went on to win all three ballgames, knocking Cleveland from earning a play-off spot. The first game was a 13-inning loss by the Indians, 3-2...The All Star break showed The Tribe with a 47-41 record, in third, eleven games out. The ballclub never held first place, but were a season-high 29 games over .500 on September 24th...Designated hitter Travis Hafner's 33 jacks, 108 RBI, and 1.003 OPS paced a team that hit .271 and 207 home runs for the season, the latter the third-most in the league. Four other players cracked at least 20 homers: Jhonny Peralta (24), Casey Blake (23), Grady Sizemore (22), and Victor Martinez (20). Sizemore, who also stroked 11 triples and 37 doubles, was second with 81 RBI; Martinez knocked in 80...Port-sider Cliff Lee posted the league's best winning percentage (.783) after he won 18 and lost only 5 games. CC Sabathia and Jake Westbrook both garnered 15 victories while Sabathia topped the pitching staff with 161 strikeouts. Kevin Millwood, 9-11 W/L, had the lowest ERA among A. L. starters (2.86). The Indians staff had the best ERA in the league (3.61).
