The two most notable items from the Mariners '05 season are the signing of Adrian Beltre (late of the Dodgers) to a free-agent contract in December 2004 at \$11.4 million and Ichiro Suzuki being named to his fifth All Star Team as well as being awarded his fifth Gold Glove. Ichiro, who played all 162 games, was among the major league leaders in several categories: base hits (206, 2<sup>nd</sup>); triples (12, 4<sup>th</sup>); and plate appearances (739, 2<sup>nd</sup>). Suzuki also collected 15 home runs, 21 doubles, 68 RBI, and 111 runs scored at age 31. Beltre slugged 19 homers while ringing-up 87 RBI and 36 doubles. Richie Sexson was the team leader in homers (39) and RBI (121). Raul Ibanez played all 162 as well and added 20 jacks and 89 RBI. Seattle hit .256 for the season and 130 home runs...Known for his effective off-speed pitching, Jamie Moyer was the pitching staff's leader in wins (13). Gil Meche was next with ten. Joel Pineiro had the most strikeouts (107). The staff ERA was 4.49...Game 81 found the M's in fourth place of the AL West with a 35-46 record and a deficit of 14 ½ games from first...Future Ace Felix Hernandez, only 19, made his big league debut August 4<sup>th</sup> against the Tigers in Detroit. Over five innings he allowed one earned run on three hits and two walks. He struck out four and was the losing pitcher of record.
