The Marlins .272 team batting average was the highest in the National League. Twenty-two-year-old Miguel Cabrera finished the season among the top ten in the following offensive categories: batting average (.323, 5th); base hits (198, 6th); total bases (344, 6th); extra-base hits (78, 8th). Carlos Delgado wielded a lot of power as well with a .582 slugging percentage and .981 OPS (both 7th in the majors). Juan Pierre finished third in the big leagues in triples (13) and fourth in stolen bases (57). Cabrera and Delgado tied for a team-leading 33 homers. Cabrera was first with 43 doubles, 116 RBI, and 106 runs scored. Delgado drove home 115 runs and clubbed 41 doubles. The team was 14th in the N. L. with 128 homers...Dontrelle Willis led the big leagues with 22 wins and 5 shutouts; he tied the Cardinals Chris Carpenter with 7 complete games. Josh Beckett won 15 ballgames while A. J. Burnett added 12. Burnett was the pitching staff's leader with 198 K's. Marlins hurlers posted a 4.16 ERA (8th in the N. L.)...Florida enjoyed 34 calendar days in first place of the NL East (the last on June 3rd). Against the division they were 34-39...The Marlins sent four players to the All Star Game: Dontrelle Willis, Miguel Cabrera, Paul Lo Duca, and Luis Castillo...Cabrera and Delgado finished fifth and sixth, respectively, in league MVP voting after the season.
