This is a tale of two half-seasons for The Birds. They won 42 of their first 72 games and had sole possession of first place from April 23<sup>rd</sup> through June 23<sup>rd</sup>. After that time atop the AL East standings, the O's saw the promising year suffer a complete collapse: a 9-26 record through August 3<sup>rd</sup> led to manager Lee Mazzilli being replaced by bench coach Sam Perlozzo. When Mazzilli was fired, the team's record was 51-56. Including his first season as manager, he was 129-140 overall as field general. The Orioles limped home 32-58 after yielding their first place perch...Melvin Mora (88 RBI) led the ballclub with 27 homers. Miguel Tejada, who was the RBI leader (98), and Jay Gibbons both launched 26 jacks. Tejada's 50 doubles tied the Cubs Derrek Lee for the most in the big leagues. As a team, Baltimore hit .269 and 189 home runs...The pitching staff's 4.56 ERA was tenth in the A. L. Rodrigo Lopez racked-up the highest win total (15) while Bruce Chen followed with 13. Daniel Cabrera whiffed 157 batters. Closer B. J. Ryan punched out 100 opposing hitters, 12.80 K's per nine innings...Perlozzo would manage the O's into the 2008 season.
