The Phillies, with a new skipper in the dugout, Charlie Manuel, were primarily a .500 ballclub in the season's first half. When the All Star break arrived, they were at 45-44, in fourth place, and 7 ½ games out of first. The team played excellent ball in the second half, going 43-30 placing them in the race for the NL East title or the NL Wild Card. They would finish two games behind division champ Atlanta, against whom the Phils won ten of their nineteen regular-season contests. The Astros sneaked in to take the Wild Card by one game. The season series versus Houston ended 6-0 in the Astros favor...At the plate, the Phillies had a very good campaign. They hit .270, second in the league, and posted the best OBP (.348). A home run total of 167 placed them eighth. Team leaders: Pat Burrell (32 homers, 117 RBI); Chase Utley (28 jacks, 105 RBI); Bobby Abreu (24 home runs, 102 RBI). Jimmy Rollins collected the most hits (196) and runs scored (115). Rookie of the Year Ryan Howard smacked 22 homers and drove in 63. At the head of the pitching staff were Jon Lieber's 17 wins while Brett Myers (13 W's) whiffed 208 opponents. Cory Lidle added 13 victories. Closer Billy Wagner struck out 87 batters. The staff ERA (4.21) was tenth in the senior circuit.
