The Tigers slipped into fourth place on June 9th following an inter-league loss to the Dodgers in L. A. and maintained that spot the rest of the season. At the All Star break, the ballclub was 42-44 and 15 games out of first place. A wretched 8-24 record in Sept./Oct. caused the dismissal of long-time Tiger favorite Alan Trammell as manager and the hire of Jim Leyland whose '06 team would win 24 more games and begin a stretch of great success for the franchise...Detroit was a solid team at the plate--.272 BA (fourth in the A. L.); 168 home runs (7th); 45 triples (1st)--but pitching was another matter (4.51 ERA, 8th in the league). Designated hitter Dmitri Young (72 RBI) smacked a team-high 21 homers while Craig Monroe hit 20 and led the Tigers with 89 runs batted in. Brandon Inge collected the most base hits (161) and drove home 72 runs. "Pudge" Rodriguez, now 33, just missed another Gold Glove despite his superlative .995 fielding average and 51 percent caught-stealing rate...The pitching staff was led by two 14-game winners: Mike Maroth and Jeremy Bonderman. The latter posted the most strikeouts (145); lefty Nate Robertson (7-16 W/L record) was next with 122 K's. Six different relievers tallied a combined 37 saves. Justin Verlander, 22, a 2004 first round draft pick, debuted July 4th against Cleveland and was the losing pitcher after allowing four earned runs in 5.3 innings. He struck out four.
